
Whatever the reason for the gift, be assured this expression of the goodness of Jesus will touch the lives of the poor and needy through works of love and mercy.

Returning to the Church, Finding Her Passion

Born in Chicago, IL, Carol attended Catholic grade school and public high school. She later attended Alverno College in Milwaukee, WI. It was there she first learned of Sacred Heart Monastery.

At that point, Carol's path in life seemed to indicate her faith would be forefront. Little did she know then her life and her faith would soon be tested.

Carol completed her bachelor's degree in nursing and went on to teach nursing at Northwestern University, and earned her master's in Mental Health. During a turbulent time in her life, Carol needed a change and moved to Florida. There, she worked as a therapist.

With the changes in the church brought about by Vatican II and the worldly events of the time, Carol drifted away from the church and completely stopped attending Mass in 1965.

In 1997, while caring for a friend who was a hospice patient, Carol met Fr. Steve, a former alumnus of the Sacred Heart Seminary and School of Theology. This chance meeting would prove to be the beginning of her return to the church.

One day, Fr. Steve came to her house to anoint her friend. It happened to be the day Carol said, "God chose to intervene in my life." It's a moment she cherishes.

"In my heart I always knew that I would return one day," shared Carol, who loved to pray the Devotion to the Sacred Heart as a young girl.

During her path back to the church, it did not take Carol long to determine there was a problem with declining numbers of vocations. Greatly disturbed by this, Carol was determined to make a difference.

Carol's belief is the priests and the Eucharist are the cornerstone of our faith. Because of this, Carol decided to support the *Sacred Heart Burse Program*.

The Burse Program is an endowment program for priestly formation and education. Burse gifts accumulate in an independent fund, which allows it to grow. As the principle of the fund grows, so do the annual earnings. Only the interest income generated by the fund is used to cover expenses. This way, we ensure funds are available in the future for the education of candidates for the priesthood.

"I'll do anything to promote vocations — it is my passion. I always loved the Catholic Church and didn't realize how much until my return," said Carol. "My faith is like the pearl of great value — no amount of money can buy it — priceless!"

There are three types of burses: Shared, Reserved and Perpetual. They can be named in honor of Christ, a saint or in memory or appreciation of a loved one.

Help Educate Future Priests

Choose from three kinds of burses:

- Shared Burses are open to anyone with a minimum gift of \$500. You may add your gift to an existing Shared Burse or start a new one.
- **Reserved Burses** are open to individuals or families who give or pledge \$5,000 at one time or over a period of five years, starting with a gift of \$1,000 or more.
- **Perpetual Burses** are open to individuals or families who give or pledge \$25,000 to be paid over a period of five years, starting with a gift of \$2,500 or more.

Burses may also be established through designation in your Will or Estate plan. What a wonderful legacy to know future priests will be educated because of your generosity!

A New Provincial Superior and Council

The U.S. Province held its Election Assembly the week of January 3-7. The morning of January 4 brought voting and election of Fr. Vien Nguyen, SCJ, as the 16th provincial superior of the U.S. Province of the Priests of the Sacred Heart (Dehonians).

"It is humbling to stand in front of you, to carry on the tradition of the U.S. Province," said Fr. Vien.

Fr. Vien, 48, previously served as vice rector and assistant professor of Scripture Studies at Sacred

Heart Seminary and School of Theology (SHSST). He professed his first vows in 1997 and was ordained to the priesthood in 2004. In 2018, he earned a doctorate from the Jesuit School of Theology of Santa Clara University in Berkeley, CA. He also earned a Th.M., and S.T.L. from Santa Clara University, and a M.Div. from Catholic Theological Union in Chicago.

Before pursuing post-graduate studies, Fr. Vien served in parish ministry and in formation.

He has been on the faculty of SHSST since 2018, and has been published in a wide variety of theological and professional publications.

After the election of Fr. Vien, the assembly turned its focus to the election of the new five-member Provincial Council. They are:

• Fr. Jack Kurps, SCJ

He made his first profession in 1972 and was ordained to the priesthood in 1977. Fr. Jack is executive director of Sacred Heart Southern Missions and previously served on the Provincial Council.

• Fr. Rafael Querobin, SCJ

He professed his first vows in 2001 and was ordained to the priesthood in 2007. Originally from Brazil, he now serves on the pastoral team of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Houston. Fr. Rafael is not new to administration; he also served on the Provincial Council of his home province (Brazil — Sao Paulo).

• Fr. Greg Schill, SCJ

He professed first vows in 2006, and was ordained in 2010. After 10 years in parish ministry in northern Mississippi, Fr. Greg is now chaplain at St. Joseph's Indian School in South Dakota.

• Br. Duane Lemke, SCJ

A previous member of the council, Br. Duane has served in formation and in parish ministry. He is currently superior of the Sacred Heart Monastery Community, province director of Justice, Peace and Reconciliation, and works with the ECS program (English and Cultural Studies) at Sacred Heart Seminary and School of Theology. Originally from South Dakota, Br. Duane literally grew up with the SCJs — he was baptized by an SCJ priest and the SCJs ministered for many years at his home parish.

Dn. David Nagel, SCJ

He was professed in 1972 and ordained to the diaconate in 2003. Currently provincial treasurer, Dn. David previously served as executive director of St. Joseph's Indian School and in formation. He has also been active with the Dehonian Associates Committee, has served on the General Finance Commission, and has previously served on the Provincial Council.

The new administration began its term on February 2, 2022.
